2019 was a year of tremendous opportunity for our community. We saw approximately 100 residential units enter various stages of completion in brand new developments near our transit hubs, and welcomed nearly 30 new businesses to our neighborhood, advancing Lakeview's status as a desirable place to live and work. We celebrated arts and culture by embracing the Year of Chicago Theatre, which activated more than 50 theaters that call the Belmont Theater District home, and by making exciting progress on a unique reimagining of the space beneath the Brown Line into a one-ofa-kind public art destination called the Lakeview Low-Line. We gathered on front porches and terraces, and filled streets and storefronts, to enjoy the sounds of local musicians, sample the tastes of Midwestern farms and neighborhood restaurants, and feel the satisfaction of healthy recreation. And we advocated for a supportive business community through more than 50 events that fostered stronger connections between our more than 250 members, including networking and educational programming.

2019 was also a year of change.

Although our work is made possible by many, I'd like to thank two people for championing the progress we've made: my former colleague and predecessor, Lee Crandell, and our outgoing SSA 27 Commission Chair, Terese McDonald. Lakeview is a stronger community thanks to the vision and leadership they committed to our cause over the past several years.



Program Spotlight

We held a four-part Marketing Mania in June at the Capital One Café, bringing together more than 60 participants and showcasing nine businesses throughout the month-long series. Sponsored by Lakeview Chamber member Be Found Online, their marketing experts presented at two sessions: one on social media advertising. and one on SEO for small businesses. We also hosted two discussion panels moderated by F. Word Consulting that addressed creative marketing strategies and customer service. The series equipped participants with a new set of tools for promoting their businesses and the opportunity to forge meaningful connections with other Lakeview Chamber members.

Program Spotlight

Vacant storefronts and vacant lots are a growing concern in neighborhoods across Chicago, negatively impacting foot traffic and hurting neighboring retailers, while diminishing a community's quality of life. In 2019, the Lakeview Chamber helped rally approximately 40 organizations and entities, including fellow chambers of commerce and government agencies, to tackle this issue head-on. The Commercial **Vacancy Coalition** is focused on engaging neighborhood organizations across Chicago in strategies to reduce vacancies by advocating for policy reform, developing local action plans and coordinating with government partners to better leverage existing tools to address chronic vacancies. In 2020, the group will release findings of a citywide study on commercial vacancies and how they impact our communities, in order to promote change.

Plants and greenery play an essential role in establishing a welcoming environment, improving air quality and creating natural beauty. 




